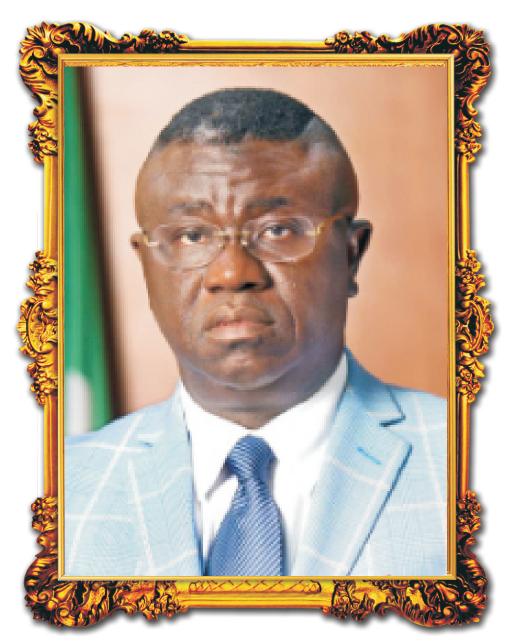

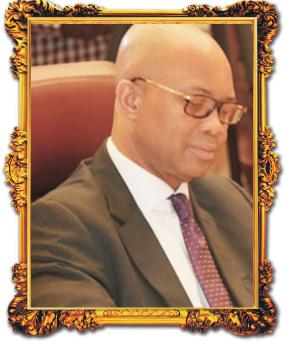

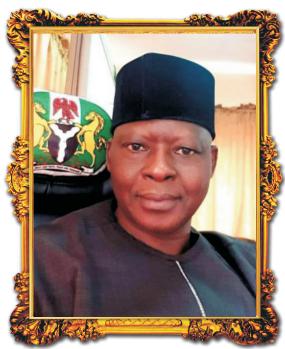

1. Introduction

1. Introduction

his Strategic Plan, which is a 5-year plan, outlines the aspirations and the strategic objectives the Federal Ministry of Finance, Budget and National Planning (Budget and National Planning Arm) has committed to achieve in the period 2023-2027. The document represents the result of a comprehensive and collaborative project that integrates the intellectual contributions and input, support, and experiences of implementing stakeholders from sectors within and outside of the Planning Arm of the Ministry. BNP's approach builds on the experience of countries and institutions that have successfully developed and implemented a Strategic Plan. The lessons and experiences from international best practices, building on their own unique knowledge and solutions were adapted to fit our approach in identifying challenges and developing the key strategies.

This plan presents a transformational overview of BNP, indicating its strategies and approach to delivering its mandate. The Plan clearly highlights strategic goals and objectives, which relate to key focus areas that BNP plans to implement for the 2023-2027 period. The document provides a situational analysis of BNP, examining and critically analyzing stakeholder assessment, institutional capacity, and performance environment.

1.1 Background

Coordination of development planning requires that the FMFBNP (BNP Arm) be a world-class public service institution that facilitates the effectiveness of Federal Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) and Sub-National governments by driving planning for sustainable growth and economic development. The strategic goals and objectives are derived from the critical issues identified in the changing environment, expectations of the critical stakeholders and the statutory mandate setting up the explicit functions of the

Ministry. The goals apply to every part of the Ministry and define what major strategic thrusts BNP will pursue to achieve its vision, mission, and mandate. The strategic objectives address strategic issues emanating from internal and external analysis and give focus to the coordination of diverse efforts and actions. Retrospectively, this plan reinvigorates BNP's resolve to reform its organization and

Retrospectively, this plan reinvigorates BNP's resolve to reform its organization and strengthen its workforce to deliver on its key strategic outputs.

1.2 FMFBNP (BNP Arm) Mandate and Structure

The Budget and National Planning Arm was originally established as National Planning Commission by Decree No 12 Of 1992 and later amended by Act 71 Of 1993 (National Planning Commission Act, CAP N66, LFN2004). The Ministry is mandated to determine and advise the Government of the Federation on matters relating to National Development and overall management of the national economy. The detailed objectives, functions, powers, and structure of the Commission are outlined under sections 2, 3 and 5 of the Establishment Act.

The Act, particularly in Section 4 (a-k), provided the Commission with the following functions:

- To provide policy advice to the President and Nigeria on all spheres of national life.
- To set national priorities and goals and engender consensus among Government Agencies, as may be contained in guidelines issued by the Commission from time to time.
- To undertake periodic review and appraisal of the capabilities of the human and material resource of Nigeria with a view to advancing their development, efficiency, and effective utilization.

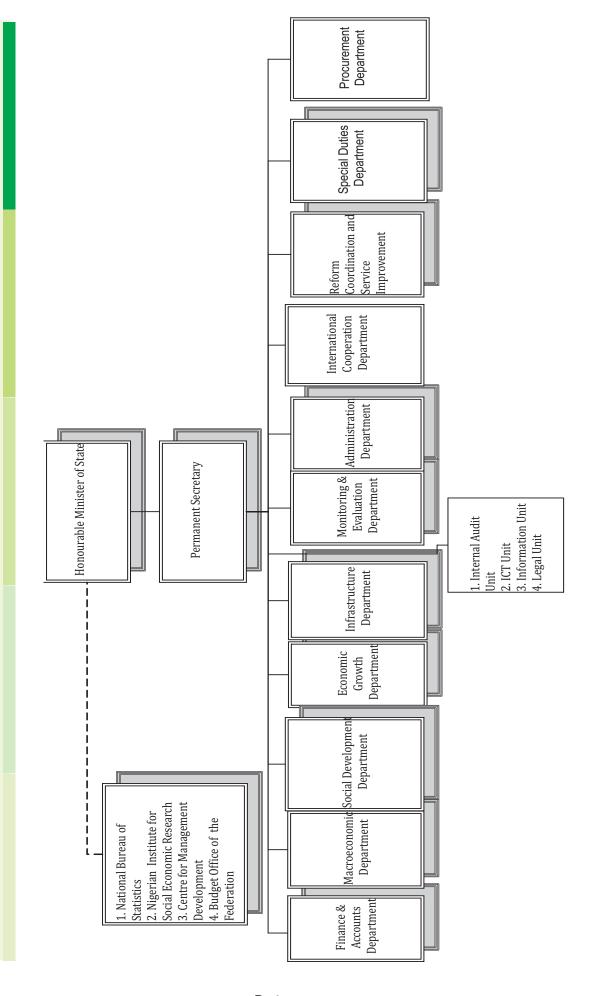
- To formulate and prepare long-term, medium-term, and short-term national development plans and to co-ordinate such plans at the Federal, State, and Local Government Levels.
- To monitor projects and progress relating to Plan Implementation.
- To advise on changes and adjustments in Institutions and Management Techniques as well as attitudes necessary for the alignment of actions with plan targets and goals.
- To conduct research into various aspects of national interest and public policy and ensure that the implications and results of the findings in such research are geared towards the enhancement of national, economic, social, technological defense and security capabilities and management.
- To mobilize popular group and Institutional consensus in support of Government Policies and Programmes.
- To manage multilateral and bilateral economic co-operation, including development aid and technical assistance.
- To deal with matters relating to regional economic co-operation, including the Economic Community of West

- African States (ECOWAS) the African Common Market (ACM), the United Nations Economic Commission for African (UNECA) and the South-South Co-operation.
- To carry out such other duties as are necessary or expedient for the full discharge of all or any of the functions conferred on the Commission under the Act.

However, the Commission's structure was not implemented as planned. Following the pronouncement of the Buhari Administration in 2015, the organization metamorphosed to the then Ministry of Budget and National Planning, which was later integrated into the current Federal Ministry of Finance, Budget and National Planning (FMFBNP) in 2019 by the same Administration at the onset of its Second (2nd) tenure. The BNP Arm of the Ministry has four parastatals under its purview, namely:

- Centre for Management Development [CMD]
- National Bureau of Statistics [NBS]
- The Nigerian Institute of Social and Economic Research [NISER]
- Budget Office of the Federation

1.3 Strategic Planning Approach

There are diverse definitions, terms, and approaches to strategic planning. The failure of having a universal agreed description, presents both a challenge and an opportunity in developing this strategic plan. The Ministry has adopted an approach that meets international best practices. The strategic plan described here is essentially the future course of strategies and action outlined by the Ministry to move it from its current position to where it desires to be in the future.

The selection of strategic goals and objectives emerged from an analysis of the internal assessment of the Ministry's current position as well as an assessment of environment in which the Ministry operates. These analyses led to identification of several priority or key focus areas which the Ministry seeks to address to adequately deliver against its purpose. The development of the ensuing strategies reflected the focus of the National Development Plan 2021-2025 and agreed ministerial deliverables.

1.4 Methodology

Methodology adopted in the development of the strategic plan consisted the following:

- i. Constitution and Inauguration of Steering Committee (SC) comprising the Honorable Minister of State, and the Chief Executive Officers of the Ministry's agencies namely, NBS, CMD, NISER and BoF as well as directors to provide managerial direction for the Strategic Plan.
- ii. Constitution and Inauguration of Technical Working Committee (TWC) to brainstorm, articulate and present a practicable Strategic Plan for the Ministry; and

- iii. Engagement of a consultant to review and submit of inception Report of the implementation of the previous strategic plan with a view to determining the success, challenges and weaknesses to provide a guide for the development of the Strategic Plan.
- iv. Review and validation meetings with Departments and Parastatals to harvest input and ratify the draft Strategic Plan.
- v. Senior Management Retreat conducted to review and acquaint the Management of the Ministry with the draft Strategic Plan 2023 2027 document was well as foster collective vision and ownership.

2. Situational Analysis

2. Situational Analysis

everal exercises were undertaken to establish and analyze key factors that needed to be considered in the development of FMFBNP's strategic objectives and plans. These are summarized below.

2.1 SWOT Analysis

An assessment of the Ministry's departments' strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats (SWOT) was conducted. The SWOT analysis supported the refocusing of strategic direction for a more productive organization. It examined the areas that the organization needs toreinforce strength, address weaknesses and mitigate threats by assessing its internal and external environments. The SWOT analysis was informed the strategy formulation and selection of the goals and objectives.

The analysis reveals an organization that has leadership support, vibrant workforce with growing and evolving potential and capacity to further develop as well as transform to a modern development planning think-tank organization. Likewise, FMFBNP (BNP Arm) has opportunities to access donor funds and collaborate on research.

2.2 Stakeholder Analysis

A Stakeholders' Analysis of the organization was also reviewed as, its effective management is critical to achieving the Ministry's goals. Stakeholders in this instance are the people or organizations who may positively or negatively impact the BNP, operation or vice versa. The analysis identified the key

stakeholders relevant to the formulation and implementation of BNP Strategic Plan. The stakeholders provide feedback into plans formulation and review. The major stakeholders are MDAs, National Assembly and Civil Society Organisations (CSO). The MDAs play a key role in Ministerial collaboration of delivering planned projects and programmes that support national vision and aspiration. The National Assembly enacts laws that underpin the implementation of critical projects and programs of the National Development Plan. The Civil Society Organization (CSO) act as watchdog in project monitoring and implementation.

3.3 Description of the Strategic Goals and Objectives

This section presents brief descriptions of the respective strategic goals and objectives. 3.3.1 Goal 1: Facilitate Efficient and Effective Planning Coordination

Goal 1: Facilitate Efficient and Effective Planning Coordination

- Objective 1.2: Improve National Plans Coordination and align sub-National Plans to the NDP

Nigeria's target for achieving its vision is based on collaborative effort of the different arms of Government. Paramount to the achievement of fostering economic development is the ability of government to consistently translate strategic intent into action and results. The Federal Ministry of Finance, Budget and National Planning (Budget and National Planning Arm)'s core mandate is to articulate a strategic vision and plan for national socioeconomic development as well as strengthen inter-governmental coordination in Nigeria. Fundamental to the achievement of the vision

are two broad objectives, Improving Plan Development at National and Sub-National Levels and improving National Plans Coordination and alignment of Sub-National Plans to the National Development Plan.

As part of its mandate, BNP facilitates effective management of the planning cycle process in Government. The core of this strategic goal will be in committing to provide evidence based and results-oriented planning development and advice to the Federal Government to support the attainment of the objectives and goals of the National Development Plan and Agenda 2050. This strategic objective will seek to achieve a system that builds and thrives on evidence-based decision making. Decisions on national plans initiatives should be predicated on sound research and backed by credible data.

Achievement of this strategic objective is expected to impact positively and influence national socio-economic development, effective implementation of national plans, capacity building and strengthening of institutions in the planning process. It will also enhance stakeholder participation, especially in areas relevant to international cooperation and investments in Nigeria. For the period covered in this Strategic Plan, BNP will focus on producing and influencing the development of:

- Socio-Economic plans, briefs and reports
- MDA and Sectoral Reports
- Country Strategy Papers

Priority in achieving this strategic objective will be to influence and achieve the NDP (2021-2025) and Nigeria Agenda 2050. This is expected to drive socio-economic growth and rapid development of Nigeria.

The strategic goal also addresses ensuring adequate coordination of national plans for the Government of Nigeria at national and subnational levels. In achievement of strategic objective, BNP will commit to providing guidance and structure to ensure effective national plans coordination to meet the goals and objectives of the NDP (2021-2025) and

Nigeria Agenda 2050. The programs and activities relating to the coordination of national plans will contribute to producing an expected strategic outcome of sustainable national socioeconomic growth and development. It is expected that as a result, focused national plans will be aligned with the NDP (2021-2025) and Nigeria Agenda 2050. Sub-regional integration will be enhanced, inter-ministerial engagement with development partners and relevant stakeholders will be achieved while the process for producing and managing key performance indicators will improve. At the sub-national level, states' and local government's capacity to contribute to and achieve national plans will be enhanced. The indicators for this period to ensure the successful implementation of this strategic objective will include:

- National (NDP 2021-2025)
 Implementation Plan
- Sectoral Performance Reports
- Priority national projects adapted
- States and MDA Reports

3.3.2 Goal 2: Maintain a predictable Budget Cycle of January to December

Goal 2: Maintain a predictable Budget Cycle of January to December

- Objective 2.1: Collaborate with the MOF, BOF, OAGF, and other MDAs to ensure timely preparation and processing of the budget for approval
- Objective 2.2: Ensure effective implementation of the approved budget by MDAs

This goal seeks to institutionalize and sustain a predictable annual budget cycle of January to December. This would facilitate effective planning at MDAs and national levels, and promote a culture of relative certainty in the timeline of budgetary preparation and legislative approval. It would also facilitate overall national economic policy planning and coordination mechanism.

3.3.3 Goal 3: Ensure effective Production, Coordination, and Dissemination of Research Outcomes

Goal 3: Ensure effective Production, Coordination, and Dissemination of Research Outcomes

- Objective 3.1: Collaborate with NISER and NBS, and other MDAs to produce relevant, timely, and adequate statistics and information needed to conduct research
- Objective 3.2: Collaborate with NISER, NBS, and other MDAs to conduct and make available relevant research and studies to facilitate evidence-driven policymaking.

As one of its key strategic objectives, BNP will commit to providing relevant, credible, and verifiable statistics. The production of national statistics for the Federal Government is a key output of the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) and as such can, and will lead to the strategic outcome of quality statistics for sustainable planning. The expected impact will ensure that statistics influence and inform decisions and actions in national planning. The indicators that will guide and influence the implementation of this strategic objective include the production of:

- Monthly Plan Implementation (MPI)reports
- Socio-economic Reports
- Survey reports on Infrastructure, Agriculture, etc.
- National and State GDP reports
- Baseline Study reports on National issues
- MDA Compliance reports on KPIs (scorecards)

Key areas of priority focus in achieving this strategic objective will include providing statistical support and statistical coordination for Federal MDAs and State Statistics Agencies (SSAs), the production of MPI and Quarterly GDP Reports, and upgrade of the National Data Centre.

BNP plans to deepen its collaboration with the Nigerian Institute for Social and Economic Research (NISER) in promoting research and learning that will contribute to a strategic outcome of world-class, global best practice standards in research and learning. This will increase adaptation, utilization, and practice of research in national planning. Improved knowledge of best practices and their implementation will be enhanced as partnerships with development partners is strengthened. As priorities in achieving this strategic objective, Budget and National Planning will commit to linking research to policy and plans and producing demand-driven policy research reports especially on migration, remittances, non-oil revenue, the informal sector, and credit to the private sector, among others.

Monitoring and Evaluation is the second critical lever in implementing the vision and a vital component of the activities of the Ministry. BNP will commit to providing a strong and effective monitoring and evaluation culture that translates to achieving a strategic outcome of improved planned and citizen-centered programme implementation. development will impact and lead to enhanced monitoring and evaluation of programmes, projects, and plans, building the capacity of MDAs and states in adapting and implementing the National Monitoring & Evaluation (M&E) framework. Increased advocacy and sensitization of government programmes, projects, and plans will be promoted. BNP will commit to producing MDA sectoral plans review reports, plan evaluation reports, improving key performance indicators (KPIs) development and assessment reports and the monitoring of international agreements, all of which will serve as indicators of successful implementation of this strategic objective.

BNP recognizes that achievement of its mandates to a large extent depend on its workforce. In this context, the need to foster and strengthen institutional capacity is imperative to the ministry. The ministry will adopt specific strategies to optimize staff performance by ensuring that properly documented processes and workflows are put in place to enhance productivity and efficiency; capacity needs will be identified, and an implementation plan developed with allocation of resources for its execution.

MBNP will work with the Centre for Management Development (CMD) and related agencies in building capacity of its workforce. This is expected to produce a strategic outcome of improved and increased human and intellectual capacity to manage and coordinate the planning process. This will enhance capacity of staff in the use of resource toolkits and applications that contribute to drive national plans development.

A set of output indicators will be developed from related themes to serve as the criteria to assess the successful implementation of this strategic objective.

They include, amongst others:

- Specialized and customized training implemented
- Review of administrative processes and procedures
- Certifications in the use of resource toolkits and applications
- Number of programmed delivery and implementation systems and structures instituted
- Professional performance assessment and service delivery evaluations
- Improvement on the IT infrastructure
- Quality assurance certifications

As key priorities in achieving this strategic objective, BNP will focus on the highest standard in quality assurance, service delivery, and performance management. In addition, BNP working in partnership with experts will provide and develop its operational capacity and ICT knowledge and utilization.

3.3.4 Goal 4: Ensure effective Institutionalization and Coordination of robust Monitoring and Evaluation Systems

A robust M&E framework is critical for an evidence-based assessment of the Strategic Plan's performance and to ensure that its goals are achieved. Within the context of the National Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) framework, priority will be accorded tracking of Plan implementation and effectiveness, and identification of bottlenecks for early resolution. The focus of the M&E plan is to institutionalize a culture of Results-Based Planning & Performance Monitoring, Reporting & use of evidence for responsive decision-making in the MBNP, MDAs, and Subnational levels of government.

Fostering effective collaboration and partnerships are essential to the Ministry to ensure sustainable socio-economic development. The purpose under this goal is to strengthen partnerships with international and national organizations through promotion of good governance to increase investment in resources and capacity development.

BNP will promote external cooperation management that will lead to a strategic outcome of establishment of key partnerships that stimulate national development. The expected outcome will include enhanced project coordination, increased and improved collaboration with international development

partners, and effective management of Official Development Assistance (ODA).

Output indicators that will ensure focus on successful implementation of this strategic objective include:

- Signed International Agreements
- Projects initiated and implemented
- Production of reports on impact analysis of grants and bilateral agreements

The major flaws in reforms and programmes, developed over the years, include corruption, lack of continuity in plan implementation, amongst others. Accordingly public sector governance should be seen to put the interests of its citizens first. In order to solicit assistance from international organizations to invest in capacity building and organizational development initiative, the Ministry should seek to develop good corporate governance structures, transparency and accountability in its transactions and administration. The BNP should develop strategies to promote good corporate governance structures such as;

- Establishment of sound financial management systems
- Foster good code of ethics and practices
- Establishment of risk management policies and frameworks
